# **Our Featured Artist: Leigh Crumrine**

"Let's Play!"

Recently, I wrangled a painting into submission; it was an epic battle. Although it had the best of me time and again, I finally set my paints aside and forced a draw. At a Friday Paint Party, Leigh Crumrine sidled up, and in her gentle manner, said, "You are your harshest critic. When something isn't working, try to deconstruct. Paint the idea in your head in a different perspective, on a horizontal or vertical plane, from above or down low, with different tools or toys."

Peg Sheridan said something similar in her November workshop. "Don't copy the photo. Make it better. **Play** with the composition."

I've painted with Leigh several times. The girl knows how to have fun, to **play**. Joyfully!

In a phone call, I asked what she was doing. "Oh, playing. Having fun."

Her art is recognizable for its unique subjects – a pile of old tires, screws, a neurological drawing – and her one-of-a-kind, signature color palette, based on Opera Pink, Peacock Blue, and Gamboge. She never met a painting tool, or toy as she calls them, she didn't want to try. She takes regular road trips through YouTube's "rat holes" (her words), discovering new challenges in painting. Leigh, although she only uses their videos as jumping off points for her own ideas. She incorporates pen & ink, and will use Zentangle anywhere in any color, with a glitter pen if that's what a painting needs. She flexes her creative muscles, using all sizes of papers, from small pieces to full sheets.

Leigh never starts with plain white paper. She especially likes Gesso and pouring. She will pour a color onto the paper, and then figure out how to make the puzzle work. Notice this in the painting of the abandoned bicycle. With her pile of tires painting, she first poured pink onto the paper, and then thought she could use a photo she took of old tires. Yet, pink was the inspiration.

She advises, "Follow your own bliss, don't paint for others or to sell a painting. You won't have nearly as much fun."
